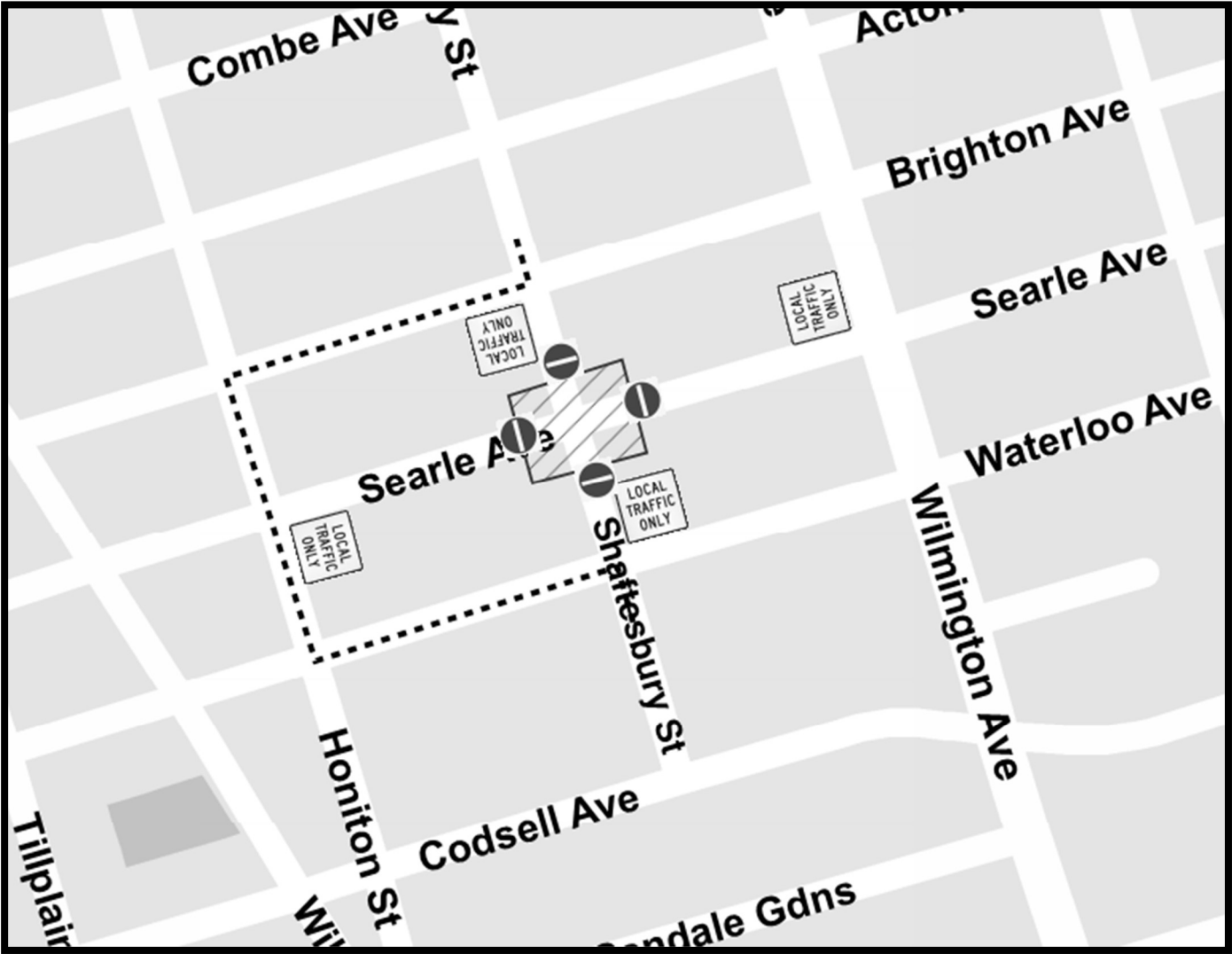
The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm sewer system in your area in order to reduce surface and basement flooding.

Due to the depth and nature of the storm sewer construction work on Shaftesbury Street, the road will be closed between Waterloo Avenue and Brighton Avenue, effective 7 a.m. on Wednesday, February 24, 2021 to 7 p.m. on Friday, February 26, 2021.

Motorists are reminded to abide by traffic/construction signs posted in local areas to ensure the safe travel of all local road users, pedestrians and cyclists. This project is part of the Council-approved 2021 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system; renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

	Traffic Management on Shaftesbury Street between Waterloo Avenue and Brighton Avenue: Shaftesbury Street will be fully closed to outside traffic. Please see detour around the closed section of the street on page 2. Local traffic including access/egress to all driveways will be maintained.
	Pedestrians: Sidewalks will be kept open for pedestrian use. When work is taking place on the sidewalk, signs will be placed to provide information about which side of the road to use.
	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday.
